



Business Description

Construcciones y Auxiliar de Ferrocarriles SA is a Spain-based company that offers comprehensive railway solutions. The company's train-related products comprise high-speed rolling stock, wheelsets, traction and communication systems, signaling systems, and related services including vehicle maintenance, vehicle upgrading and refurbishment, and aftersales technical supports. In addition to supplying train-related products, the company also helps customers conduct viability studies, civil work, electrification projects, and system operation. The company operates under concession or turnkey models. Construcciones y Auxiliar de Ferrocarriles has a global presence, with Europe and Brazil being the two largest markets.

Valuation ^Qas of 17 May 2024

CAF achieves a 3-star quantitative star rating based on Morningstar's equity model. This reflects the company's valuation and uncertainty scores under this assessment system.

The Quantitative Fair Value estimate is 37.31, above the previous closing price of 33.80. The stock has been trading between a 23.22% and 4.17% discount to its quantitative fair value over the past year. The stock's current valuation rating sits at the 76th percentile in the coverage universe and 63rd percentile in the industrials sector (higher percentile indicates more undervalued).

The quantitative uncertainty rating for CAF is High. Our quantitative star rating last differed from the current rating on 04/30/2024; the uncertainty rating last differed on 05/01/2024. The previous ratings were 4 and Very High, respectively.

The main drivers of the company's valuation and uncertainty are its earnings yield and volatility. The earnings yield of 7.69% falls at the 79th percentile in the equity universe and the 77th percentile in its

sector. The annualized trailing 12-month volatility of 17.87% corresponds to the 15th percentile overall and the 15th percentile in the industry.

Economic Moat ^Qas of 17 May 2024

Morningstar maintains a quantitative moat rating of None on the company. The firm's quantitative moat score of 0.39 sits at the 36th percentile in the industrials sector. This is a decrease from 0.55, the maximum of its moat scores over the past year.

The quantitative financial health rating for CAF is Moderate. Its financial health score, termed Distance to Default, sits at the 69th percentile in both the universe and sector.

The significant drivers of these ratings are the company's book value yield and enterprise value-to-market value ratio. The book value yield for CAF is 73.91%, and its enterprise value-to-market value ratio is 1.21. They sit at the 60th and 65th percentile in the global equity universe, respectively.

Fundamentals as of 17 May 2024

The earnings per share for CAF is 2.6. The company earns a return on invested capital of 6.82%, falling at the 53rd percentile in the industrials sector. The firm maintains a dividend yield of 2.68%. We calculate the above figures over a trailing 12-month period.

Examining valuation further, we find CAF holds a price-to-earnings ratio of 13, a figure greater than 32% of its sector peers. The company's price-to-free cash flow ratio is 42.56, greater than 83% of its sector peers. These values are calculated using the stock's price at last market close.

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

Morningstar, Inc.'s quantitative equity ratings are forward looking and are generated by a statistical model that is based on Morningstar Inc.'s analyst-driven equity ratings and quantitative statistics. Given the nature of the quantitative report and the quantitative ratings, there is no one analyst in which a given report is attributed to; however, Mr. Lee Davidson, Head of Quantitative Research for Morningstar, Inc., is responsible for overseeing the methodology that supports the quantitative equity ratings used in this report. Quantitative Equity Ratings

Morningstar's quantitative equity ratings consist of: (i) Quantitative Fair Value Estimate, (ii) Quantitative Star Rating, (iii) Quantitative Uncertainty, (iv) Quantitative Economic Moat, and (v) Quantitative Financial Health (collectively the "Quantitative Ratings).

The Quantitative Ratings are calculated daily and derived from the analyst-driven ratings of a company's peers as determined by statistical algorithms. Morningstar, Inc. ("Morningstar", "we", "our") calculates Quantitative Ratings for companies whether or not it already provides analyst ratings and qualitative coverage. In some cases, the Quantitative Ratings may differ from the analyst ratings because a company's analyst-driven ratings can significantly differ from other companies in its peer group.

- i. Quantitative Fair Value Estimate: Intended to represent Morningstar's estimate of the per share dollar amount that a company's equity is worth today. Morningstar calculates the Quantitative Fair Value Estimate using a statistical model derived from the Fair Value Estimate Morningstar's equity analysts assign to companies. - ii. **Quantitative Economic Moat:** Intended to describe the strength of a firm's competitive position. It is calculated using an algorithm designed to predict the Economic Moat rating a Morningstar analyst would assign to the stock. The rating is expressed as Narrow, Wide, or None.

Narrow – assigned when the probability of a stock receiving a "Wide Moat" rating by an analyst is greater than 70% but less than 99%.

Wide — assigned when the probability of a stock receiving a "Wide Moat" rating by an analyst is greater than 99%.

None — assigned when the probability of an analyst receiving a "Wide Moat" rating by an analyst is less than 70%.

- iii. **Quantitative Star Rating:** Intended to be the summary rating based on the combination of our Quantitative Fair Value Estimate, current market price, Quantitative Uncertainty Rating, and momentum. The rating is expressed as One-Star, Two-Star, Three-Star, Four-Star, and Five-Star.

After the initial calculation for the star rating, there is a final filtering step based on the momentum of the company. We rank the companies based on their 12-1 month momentum, then restrict those below the 30th percentile to a maximum of 3 stars

iv. **Quantitative Uncertainty:** Intended to represent Morningstar's level of uncertainty about the accuracy of the Quantitative Fair Value Estimate. Generally, the lower the Quantitative Uncertainty, the narrower the potential range of outcomes for that particular company. The rating is expressed as Low, Medium, High, Very High, and Extreme.

Low – the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 10%
Medium – the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 15%
but greater than 10%

 $\bar{\text{\textbf{High}}}$ — the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 35% but greater than 15%

Very High – the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 80% but greater than 35%

v. **Quantitative Financial Health:** Intended to reflect the probability that a firm will face financial distress in the near future. The calculation uses a predictive model designed to anticipate when a company may default on its financial obligations. The rating is expressed as Weak, Moderate, and Strong.

Other Definitions

- i. Last Close Price of the stock as of the close of the market of the last trading day before date of the report.
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Undervalued – Last Price is below Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

Farily Valued – Last Price is in line with Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

Farily Valued – Last Price is in line with Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

Overvalued – Last Price is above Morningstar's quantitative fair value

The ESG Risk Rating Assessment is a visual representation of Sustainalytics ESG Risk Categories on a 1 to 5 scale.
