


Business Description

Airtificial Intelligence Structures SA is a prominent Spanish company in the field of Artificial Intelligence, Robotics, and the Development of Intelligent Structures. The company provides design and manufacturing technology solutions for the automotive, aeronautics, infrastructure, and other industrial sectors. It operates in the Aerospace & Defense, Infrastructure, and Intelligent Robots segments. The majority of the company's revenues are derived from the Intelligent Robots segment that caters to the automotive sector, specifically, in assembly, test, and test lines.

Valuation ^Qas of 11 May 2024

Morningstar maintains a 3-star quantitative star rating for Airtificial Intelligence, derived from the firm's valuation and uncertainty scores.

The company's shares last closed at 0.13, below our quantitative fair value estimate of 0.15. These shares have traded between a 42.53% and 10.22% discount to their fair value estimate over the past year. In Morningstar's equity coverage universe for this methodology, the company's valuation rating lands at the 71st percentile; in the industrials sector, the firm's score lies at the 56th percentile (meaning the shares are more undervalued than 56% of stocks in the sector).

Furthermore, Airtificial Intelligence maintains a quantitative valuation uncertainty rating of Very

The company has held this star rating over the past year. The uncertainty rating for Airtificial Intelligence has remained Very High since the previous rating of High, which was last assigned on 05/08/2024.

The key factors behind these ratings are the company's volume and drawdown. The trailing 12-month average volume (primary share) is 5,588,810

shares, and its maximum trailing 12-month maximum drawdown is 36.53%. The volume falls at the 90th percentile in the industrials sector while the drawdown is at the 70th percentile. Over the past year, the company's volume has been between 3,803,688 shares and 7,504,194 shares; its drawdown has ranged between 36.09% and 36.53%.

Economic Moat ^Q as of 13 May 2024

With a Morningstar quantitative moat rating of None, the quantitative moat score for Airtificial Intelligence falls at the 10th percentile in the industrials sector and at the 14th in the equity coverage universe. The company has maintained its None quantitative moat rating for the last year.

We also assign a Moderate quantitative financial health rating to Airtificial Intelligence. The company's raw score on this metric, termed Distance to Default, ranks at the 25th percentile overall and 23rd in the industrials sector. Furthermore, this financial health rating has stayed Moderate over the last year.

Supporting these ratings are the company's book value yield and enterprise value-to-market value ratio. The book value yield of 37.14%, ranks at the 34th percentile in the covered equity universe and at the 35th percentile among its peers. Meanwhile, its enterprise value-to-market value ratio of 1.10, falls at the 56th percentile in the universe and the 49th percentile in the industrials sector.

Fundamentals as of 11 May 2024

Airtificial Intelligence maintains losses per share of -0.01. The company further earns a return on invested capital of -7.26%. These values are calculated over a trailing 12-month period.


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

Quantitative Equity Report Overview

The quantitative report on equities consists of data, statistics and quantitative equity ratings on equity securities. Morningstar, Inc.'s quantitative equity ratings are forward looking and are generated by a statistical model that is based on Morningstar Inc.'s analyst-driven equity ratings and quantitative statistics. Given the nature of the quantitative report and the quantitative ratings, there is no one analyst in which a given report is attributed to; however, Mr. Lee Davidson, Head of Quantitative Research for Morningstar, Inc., is responsible for overseeing the methodology that supports the quantitative equity ratings used in this report. As an employee of Morningstar, Inc., Mr. Davidson is guided by Morningstar, Inc.'s Code of Ethics and Personal Securities Trading Policy in carrying out his responsibilities.

Quantitative Equity Ratings

Morningstar's quantitative equity ratings consist of: (i) Quantitative Fair Value Estimate, (ii) Quantitative Star Rating, (iii) Quantitative Uncertainty, (iv) Quantitative Economic Moat, and (v) Quantitative Financial Health (collectively the "Quantitative Ratings).

The Quantitative Ratings are calculated daily and derived from the analyst-driven ratings of a company's peers as determined by statistical algorithms. Morningstar, Inc. ("Morningstar", "we", "our") calculates Quantitative Ratings for companies whether or not it already provides analyst ratings and qualitative coverage. In some cases, the Quantitative Ratings may differ from the analyst ratings because a company's analyst-driven ratings can significantly differ from other companies in its peer group.

- i. Quantitative Fair Value Estimate: Intended to represent Morningstar's estimate of the per share dollar amount that a company's equity is worth today. Morningstar calculates the Quantitative Fair Value Estimate using a statistical model derived from the Fair Value Estimate Morningstar's equity analysts assign to companies. - ii. **Quantitative Economic Moat:** Intended to describe the strength of a firm's competitive position. It is calculated using an algorithm designed to predict the Economic Moat rating a Morningstar analyst would assign to the stock. The rating is expressed as Narrow, Wide, or None.

Narrow – assigned when the probability of a stock receiving a "Wide Moat" rating by an analyst is greater than 70% but less than 99%.

Wide — assigned when the probability of a stock receiving a "Wide Moat" rating by an analyst is greater than 99%.

None — assigned when the probability of an analyst receiving a "Wide Moat" rating by an analyst is less than 70%.

- iii. **Quantitative Star Rating:** Intended to be the summary rating based on the combination of our Quantitative Fair Value Estimate, current market price, Quantitative Uncertainty Rating, and momentum. The rating is expressed as One-Star, Two-Star, Three-Star, Four-Star, and Five-Star.

After the initial calculation for the star rating, there is a final filtering step based on the momentum of the company. We rank the companies based on their 12-1 month momentum, then restrict those below the 30th percentile to a maximum of 3 stars

iv. **Quantitative Uncertainty:** Intended to represent Morningstar's level of uncertainty about the accuracy of the Quantitative Fair Value Estimate. Generally, the lower the Quantitative Uncertainty, the narrower the potential range of outcomes for that particular company. The rating is expressed as Low, Medium, High, Very High, and Extreme.

Low – the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 10%
Medium – the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 15%
but greater than 10%

 $\vec{\text{High}}-\text{the}$ interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 35% but greater than 15%

Very High – the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 80% but greater than 35%

Extreme – the interquartile range for possible fair values is greater than 80%

v. **Quantitative Financial Health:** Intended to reflect the probability that a firm will face financial distress in the near future. The calculation uses a predictive model designed to anticipate when a company may default on its financial obligations. The rating is expressed as Weak, Moderate, and Strong.

Weak — assigned when Quantitative Financial Health < 0.2

Moderate — assigned when Quantitative Financial Health is between 0.2

and 0.7

Strong – assigned when Quantitative Financial Health > 0.7

Other Definitions

- i. Last Close Price of the stock as of the close of the market of the last trading day before date of the report.
- Quantitative Valuation— Using the below terms, intended to denote the relationship between the security's Last Price and Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate for that security.

Undervalued – Last Price is below Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

Farily Valued – Last Price is in line with Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

Farily Valued – Last Price is in line with Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

Overvalued – Last Price is above Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate

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The ESG Risk Rating Assessment is a visual representation of Sustainalytics ESG Risk Categories on a 1 to 5 scale.
