



Business Description

Talgo SA is a Spain-based company engaged in the design and manufacture of rolling stock. It operates in three business segments: Rolling stock, which accounts for the majority of revenue; Auxiliary machines & Others; and General. The Rolling stock segment is responsible for train production, as well as for the maintenance of trains that use the company's technology. The Auxiliary Machines & Others segment provides the manufacture and technical service of lathes, as well as the sale of related spare parts. The company's product range comprises high-speed rolling stock, intercity trains, and locomotives, among others. Talgo's geographical segments are Spain, the Rest of Europe, America, the Middle East & North Africa, the Commonwealth of Independent States, and APAC.

Valuation ^Qas of 7 May 2024

Morningstar maintains a 3-star quantitative star rating for Talgo, derived from the firm's valuation and uncertainty scores.

The company's shares last closed at 4.42, below our quantitative fair value estimate of 4.75. These shares have traded between a 20.84% and 1.31% discount to their fair value estimate over the past year. In Morningstar's equity coverage universe for this methodology, the company's valuation rating lands at the 81st percentile; in the industrials sector, the firm's score lies at the 71st percentile (meaning the shares are more undervalued than 71% of stocks in the sector).

Furthermore, Talgo maintains a quantitative valuation uncertainty rating of High.

The company has held this star rating since the previous rating of 4, which was last assigned on 12/25/2023. The uncertainty rating for Talgo has remained High since the previous rating of Very High, which was last assigned on 04/01/2024.

The key factor behind these ratings is the company's enterprise value-to-market value ratio of 1.55 which falls above the 79th percentile in the industrials sector. Over the past year, the company's EV-MV ratio has been between 1.30 and 1.59.

Economic Moat ^Qas of 7 May 2024

With a Morningstar quantitative moat rating of None, the quantitative moat score for Talgo falls at the 29th percentile in the industrials sector and at the 30th in the equity coverage universe. The company has maintained its None quantitative moat rating for the last year.

We also assign a Moderate quantitative financial health rating to Talgo. The company's raw score on this metric, termed Distance to Default, ranks at the 39th percentile overall and 38th in the industrials sector. Furthermore, this financial health rating has stayed Moderate over the last year.

Supporting these ratings are the company's book value yield and annualized trailing 12-month volatility. The book value yield of 51.35%, ranks at the 45th percentile in the covered equity universe and at the 46th percentile among its peers. Meanwhile, its annualized trailing 12-month volatility of 24.62%, falls at the 33rd percentile in the universe and the 38th percentile in the industrials sector.

Fundamentals as of 7 May 2024


The earnings per share for Talgo is 0.11. The company earns a return on invested capital of 5.97%, falling at the 47th percentile in the industrials sector. The firm maintains a dividend yield of 2.11%. We calculate the above figures over a trailing 12-month period.

Examining valuation further, we find Talgo holds a price-to-earnings ratio of 40.14, a figure greater than 84% of its sector peers.

Quantitative Equity Report Overview

The quantitative report on equities consists of data, statistics and quantitative equity ratings on equity securities. Morningstar, Inc.'s quantitative equity ratings are forward looking and are generated by a statistical model that is based on Morningstar Inc.'s analyst-driven equity ratings and quantitative statistics. Given the nature of the quantitative report and the quantitative ratings, there is no one analyst in which a given report is attributed to; however, Mr. Lee Davidson, Head of Quantitative Research for Morningstar, Inc., is responsible for overseeing the methodology that supports the quantitative equity ratings used in this report. As an employee of Morningstar, Inc., Mr. Davidson is guided by Morningstar, Inc.'s Code of Ethics and Personal Securities Trading Policy in carrying out his responsibilities.

Quantitative Equity Ratings

Morningstar's quantitative equity ratings consist of: (i) Quantitative Fair Value Estimate, (ii) Quantitative Star Rating, (iii) Quantitative Uncertainty, (iv) Quantitative Economic Moat, and (v) Quantitative Financial Health (collectively the "Quantitative Ratings).

The Quantitative Ratings are calculated daily and derived from the analyst-driven ratings of a company's peers as determined by statistical algorithms. Morningstar, Inc. ("Morningstar", "we", "our") calculates Quantitative Ratings for companies whether or not it already provides analyst ratings and qualitative coverage. In some cases, the Quantitative Ratings may differ from the analyst ratings because a company's analyst-driven ratings can significantly differ from other companies in its peer group.

- i. Quantitative Fair Value Estimate: Intended to represent Morningstar's estimate of the per share dollar amount that a company's equity is worth today. Morningstar calculates the Quantitative Fair Value Estimate using a statistical model derived from the Fair Value Estimate Morningstar's equity analysts assign to companies. - ii. **Quantitative Economic Moat:** Intended to describe the strength of a firm's competitive position. It is calculated using an algorithm designed to predict the Economic Moat rating a Morningstar analyst would assign to the stock. The rating is expressed as Narrow, Wide, or None.

Narrow – assigned when the probability of a stock receiving a "Wide Moat" rating by an analyst is greater than 70% but less than 99%.

Wide — assigned when the probability of a stock receiving a "Wide Moat" rating by an analyst is greater than 99%.

None — assigned when the probability of an analyst receiving a "Wide Moat" rating by an analyst is less than 70%.

- iii. **Quantitative Star Rating:** Intended to be the summary rating based on the combination of our Quantitative Fair Value Estimate, current market price, Quantitative Uncertainty Rating, and momentum. The rating is expressed as One-Star, Two-Star, Three-Star, Four-Star, and Five-Star.

After the initial calculation for the star rating, there is a final filtering step based on the momentum of the company. We rank the companies based on their 12-1 month momentum, then restrict those below the 30th percentile to a maximum of 3 stars

iv. **Quantitative Uncertainty:** Intended to represent Morningstar's level of uncertainty about the accuracy of the Quantitative Fair Value Estimate. Generally, the lower the Quantitative Uncertainty, the narrower the potential range of outcomes for that particular company. The rating is expressed as Low, Medium, High, Very High, and Extreme.

Low – the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 10%
Medium – the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 15%
but greater than 10%

 $\overrightarrow{\text{High}}-\text{the}$ interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 35% but greater than 15%

Very High – the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 80% but greater than 35%

v. **Quantitative Financial Health:** Intended to reflect the probability that a firm will face financial distress in the near future. The calculation uses a predictive model designed to anticipate when a company may default on its financial obligations. The rating is expressed as Weak, Moderate, and Strong.

Other Definitions

- i. Last Close Price of the stock as of the close of the market of the last trading day before date of the report.
- Quantitative Valuation— Using the below terms, intended to denote the relationship between the security's Last Price and Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate for that security.

Undervalued – Last Price is below Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

Farily Valued – Last Price is in line with Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

Farily Valued – Last Price is in line with Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

Overvalued – Last Price is above Morningstar's quantitative fair value

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Based on their quantitative scores, companies are grouped into one of five Risk Categories (negligible, low, medium, high, severe). These risk categories are absolute, meaning that a 'high risk' assessment reflects a comparable degree



of unmanaged ESG risk across all subindustries covered.

The ESG Risk Rating Assessment is a visual representation of Sustainalytics ESG Risk Categories on a 1 to 5 scale.
