



Valuation as of 3 May 2024

Acerinox achieves a 3-star quantitative star rating based on Morningstar's equity model. This reflects the company's valuation and uncertainty scores under this assessment system.

The Quantitative Fair Value estimate is 11.22, above the previous closing price of 10.23. The stock has been trading between a 16.81% and 2.9% discount to its quantitative fair value over the past year. The stock's current valuation rating sits at the 80th percentile in the coverage universe and 89th percentile in the basic materials sector (higher percentile indicates more undervalued).

Our quantitative star rating last differed from the current rating on 03/11/2024; the uncertainty rating last differed on 04/01/2024. The previous ratings were 4 and Very High, respectively.

The main drivers of the company's valuation and uncertainty are its earnings yield and volatility. The earnings yield of 8.99% falls at the 82nd percentile in the equity universe and the 88th percentile in its sector. The annualized trailing 12-month volatility of 17.67% corresponds to the 15th percentile overall and the 8th percentile in the industry.

Economic Moat ^aas of 3 May 2024

With a Morningstar quantitative moat rating of None, the quantitative moat score for Acerinox falls at the 17th percentile in the basic materials sector and at the 16th in the equity coverage universe. The company has maintained its None quantitative moat rating for the last year.

We also assign a Moderate quantitative financial health rating to Acerinox. The company's raw score on this metric, termed Distance to Default, ranks at the 73rd percentile overall and 86th in the basic materials sector. Furthermore, this financial health rating most recently changed from Strong after 04/15/2024.

Supporting these ratings are the company's book value yield and enterprise value-to-market value ratio. The book value yield of 94.46%, ranks at the 69th percentile in the covered equity universe and at the 68th percentile among its peers. Meanwhile, its enterprise value-to-market value ratio of 1.13, falls at the 59th percentile in the universe and the 66th percentile in the basic materials sector.

Fundamentals as of 3 May 2024

Acerinox reports earnings per share of 0.92. Its return on invested capital is 5.36%. The company maintains a dividend yield of 6.03%, paying out 65.22% of earnings. These values are calculated over a trailing 12-month period.

As of last market close, Acerinox has a price-toearnings ratio of 11.12, falling at the 31st percentile in its sector (where a lower percentile means a lower ratio) and ranging between 5.53 and 15.31 over the past year. The company's price-to-free cash flow ratio is 8.32, falling at the 28th percentile in its sector and ranging between 4 and 11.89 over the past year.

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

Quantitative Equity Report Overview

The quantitative report on equities consists of data, statistics and quantitative equity ratings on equity securities. Morningstar, Inc.'s quantitative equity ratings are forward looking and are generated by a statistical model that is based on Morningstar Inc.'s analyst-driven equity ratings and quantitative statistics. Given the nature of the quantitative report and the quantitative ratings, there is no one analyst in which a given report is attributed to; however, Mr. Lee Davidson, Head of Quantitative Research for Morningstar, Inc., is responsible for overseeing the methodology that supports the quantitative equity ratings used in this report. As an employee of Morningstar, Inc., Mr. Davidson is guided by Morningstar, Inc.'s Code of Ethics and Personal Securities Trading Policy in carrying out his responsibilities.

Quantitative Equity Ratings

Morningstar's quantitative equity ratings consist of: (i) Quantitative Fair Value Estimate, (ii) Quantitative Star Rating, (iii) Quantitative Uncertainty, (iv) Quantitative Economic Moat, and (v) Quantitative Financial Health (collectively the "Quantitative Ratings).

The Quantitative Ratings are calculated daily and derived from the analyst-driven ratings of a company's peers as determined by statistical algorithms. Morningstar, Inc. ("Morningstar", "we", "our") calculates Quantitative Ratings for companies whether or not it already provides analyst ratings and qualitative coverage. In some cases, the Quantitative Ratings may differ from the analyst ratings because a company's analyst-driven ratings can significantly differ from other companies in its peer group.

- i. Quantitative Fair Value Estimate: Intended to represent Morningstar's estimate of the per share dollar amount that a company's equity is worth today. Morningstar calculates the Quantitative Fair Value Estimate using a statistical model derived from the Fair Value Estimate Morningstar's equity analysts assign to companies. - ii. **Quantitative Economic Moat:** Intended to describe the strength of a firm's competitive position. It is calculated using an algorithm designed to predict the Economic Moat rating a Morningstar analyst would assign to the stock. The rating is expressed as Narrow, Wide, or None.

Narrow – assigned when the probability of a stock receiving a "Wide Moat" rating by an analyst is greater than 70% but less than 99%.

Wide — assigned when the probability of a stock receiving a "Wide Moat" rating by an analyst is greater than 99%.

None — assigned when the probability of an analyst receiving a "Wide Moat" rating by an analyst is less than 70%.

- iii. **Quantitative Star Rating:** Intended to be the summary rating based on the combination of our Quantitative Fair Value Estimate, current market price, Quantitative Uncertainty Rating, and momentum. The rating is expressed as One-Star, Two-Star, Three-Star, Four-Star, and Five-Star.

After the initial calculation for the star rating, there is a final filtering step based on the momentum of the company. We rank the companies based on their 12-1 month momentum, then restrict those below the 30th percentile to a maximum of 3 stars

iv. **Quantitative Uncertainty:** Intended to represent Morningstar's level of uncertainty about the accuracy of the Quantitative Fair Value Estimate. Generally, the lower the Quantitative Uncertainty, the narrower the potential range of outcomes for that particular company. The rating is expressed as Low, Medium, High, Very High, and Extreme.

Low – the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 10%
Medium – the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 15%
but greater than 10%

 $\bar{\text{\textbf{High}}}$ — the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 35% but greater than 15%

Very High – the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 80% but greater than 35%

Extreme – the interquartile range for possible fair values is greater than 80%

v. **Quantitative Financial Health:** Intended to reflect the probability that a firm will face financial distress in the near future. The calculation uses a predictive model designed to anticipate when a company may default on its financial obligations. The rating is expressed as Weak, Moderate, and Strong.

Weak — assigned when Quantitative Financial Health < 0.2

Moderate — assigned when Quantitative Financial Health is between 0.2

and 0.7

Strong – assigned when Quantitative Financial Health > 0.7

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- i. Last Close Price of the stock as of the close of the market of the last trading day before date of the report.
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Undervalued – Last Price is below Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

Farily Valued – Last Price is in line with Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

Farily Valued – Last Price is in line with Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

Overvalued – Last Price is above Morningstar's quantitative fair value

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Based on their quantitative scores, companies are grouped into one of five Risk Categories (negligible, low, medium, high, severe). These risk categories are absolute, meaning that a 'high risk' assessment reflects a comparable degree



of unmanaged ESG risk across all subindustries covered.

The ESG Risk Rating Assessment is a visual representation of Sustainalytics ESG Risk Categories on a 1 to 5 scale.
