


Obrascon Huarte Lain achieves a 3-star quantitative star rating based on Morningstar's equity model. This reflects the company's valuation and uncertainty scores under this assessment system.

The Quantitative Fair Value estimate is 0.43, above the previous closing price of 0.31. The stock has been trading between a 50.15% and 26.16% discount to its quantitative fair value over the past year. The stock's current valuation rating sits at the 49th percentile in the coverage universe and 31st percentile in the industrials sector (higher percentile indicates more undervalued).

The quantitative uncertainty rating for Obrascon Huarte Lain is Very High.

Our quantitative star rating last differed from the current rating on 02/19/2024; the uncertainty rating last differed on 04/01/2024. The previous ratings were 4 and Extreme, respectively.

The main drivers of the company's valuation and uncertainty are its book value yield and drawdown. The book value yield of 303.84% falls at the 95th percentile in the equity universe and the 95th percentile in its sector. The trailing 12-month maximum drawdown of 38.09% corresponds to the 63rd percentile overall and the 72nd percentile in the industry.

Economic Moat ^Qas of 26 Apr 2024

With a Morningstar quantitative moat rating of None, the quantitative moat score for Obrascon Huarte Lain falls at the 10th percentile in the industrials sector and at the 15th in the equity coverage universe. The company has maintained its None quantitative moat rating for the last year. We also assign a Strong quantitative financial health rating to Obrascon Huarte Lain. The company's raw score on this metric, termed Distance to Default, ranks at the 95th percentile overall and in the industrials sector. Furthermore, this financial health rating most recently changed from Moderate after 12/04/2023.

Supporting these ratings are the company's book value yield and enterprise value-to-market value ratio. The book value yield of 303.84%, ranks at the 95th percentile overall and among its peers. Meanwhile, its enterprise value-to-market value ratio of 0.22, falls at the 7th percentile in the universe and the 5th percentile in the industrials sector.

Fundamentals as of 26 Apr 2024

Obrascon Huarte Lain maintains earnings per share of 0.01. The company further earns a return on invested capital of 0.57%. These values are calculated over a trailing 12-month period.

As of last market close, Obrascon Huarte Lain has a price-to-earnings ratio of 17.99, falling below the 51st percentile in its sector (where a lower percentile means a lower ratio) and ranging between 17.97 and 27.72 over the past year. The company's price-to-free cash flow ratio is 0.81, falling at the 5th percentile in its sector and ranging between 0.8 and 11.68 over the past year.



Quantitative Equity Report Overview

The quantitative report on equities consists of data, statistics and quantitative equity ratings on equity securities. Morningstar, Inc.'s quantitative equity ratings are forward looking and are generated by a statistical model that is based on Morningstar Inc.'s analyst-driven equity ratings and quantitative statistics. Given the nature of the quantitative report and the quantitative ratings, there is no one analyst in which a given report is attributed to; however, Mr. Lee Davidson, Head of Quantitative Research for Morningstar, Inc., is responsible for overseeing the methodology that supports the quantitative equity ratings used in this report. As an employee of Morningstar, Inc., Mr. Davidson is guided by Morningstar, Inc.'s Code of Ethics and Personal Securities Trading Policy in carrying out his responsibilities.

Quantitative Equity Ratings

Morningstar's quantitative equity ratings consist of: (i) Quantitative Fair Value Estimate, (ii) Quantitative Star Rating, (iii) Quantitative Uncertainty, (iv) Quantitative Economic Moat, and (v) Quantitative Financial Health (collectively the "Quantitative Ratings).

The Quantitative Ratings are calculated daily and derived from the analystdriven ratings of a company's peers as determined by statistical algorithms. Morningstar, Inc. ("Morningstar", "we", "our") calculates Quantitative Ratings for companies whether or not it already provides analyst ratings and qualitative coverage. In some cases, the Quantitative Ratings may differ from the analyst ratings because a company's analyst-driven ratings can significantly differ from other companies in its peer group.

i. **Quantitative Fair Value Estimate:** Intended to represent Morningstar's estimate of the per share dollar amount that a company's equity is worth today. Morningstar calculates the Quantitative Fair Value Estimate using a statistical model derived from the Fair Value Estimate Morningstar's equity analysts assign to companies. Please go to http://global.morningstar.com/ equitydisclosures for information about Fair Value Estimate Morningstar's equity analysts assign to companies.

ii. **Quantitative Economic Moat:** Intended to describe the strength of a firm's competitive position. It is calculated using an algorithm designed to predict the Economic Moat rating a Morningstar analyst would assign to the stock. The rating is expressed as Narrow, Wide, or None.

Narrow – assigned when the probability of a stock receiving a "Wide Moat" rating by an analyst is greater than 70% but less than 99%.

Wide – assigned when the probability of a stock receiving a "Wide Moat" rating by an analyst is greater than 99%.

None – assigned when the probability of an analyst receiving a "Wide Moat" rating by an analyst is less than 70%.

iii. **Quantitative Star Rating:** Intended to be the summary rating based on the combination of our Quantitative Fair Value Estimate, current market price, Quantitative Uncertainty Rating, and momentum. The rating is expressed as One-Star, Two-Star, Three-Star, Four-Star, and Five-Star.

After the initial calculation for the star rating, there is a final filtering step based on the momentum of the company. We rank the companies based on their 12-1 month momentum, then restrict those below the 30th percentile to a maximum of 3 stars.

iv. **Quantitative Uncertainty:** Intended to represent Morningstar's level of uncertainty about the accuracy of the Quantitative Fair Value Estimate. Generally, the lower the Quantitative Uncertainty, the narrower the potential range of outcomes for that particular company. The rating is expressed as Low, Medium, High, Very High, and Extreme.

Low – the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 10% Medium – the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 15% but greater than 10%

High – the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 35% but greater than 15%

 $Very\ High\ -$ the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 80% but greater than 35%

 $\ensuremath{\textit{Extreme}}\xspace -$ the interquartile range for possible fair values is greater than 80%

v. **Quantitative Financial Health:** Intended to reflect the probability that a firm will face financial distress in the near future. The calculation uses a predictive model designed to anticipate when a company may default on its financial obligations. The rating is expressed as Weak, Moderate, and Strong.

Weak – assigned when Quantitative Financial Health < 0.2

Strong - assigned when Quantitative Financial Health > 0.7

Other Definitions

i. Last Close – Price of the stock as of the close of the market of the last trading day before date of the report.

ii. **Quantitative Valuation**– Using the below terms, intended to denote the relationship between the security's **Last Price** and Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate for that security.

Undervalued – Last Price is below Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

Farily Valued – Last Price is in line with Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

Farily Valued – Last Price is in line with Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

Overvalued – Last Price is above Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

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Based on their quantitative scores, companies are grouped into one of five Risk Categories (negligible, low, medium, high, severe). These risk categories are absolute, meaning that a 'high risk' assessment reflects a comparable degree



of unmanaged ESG risk across all subindustries covered.

The ESG Risk Rating Assessment is a visual representation of Sustainalytics ESG Risk Categories on a 1 to 5 scale.
