

Business Description

Airtificial Intelligence Structures SA is a prominent Spanish company in the field of Artificial Intelligence, Robotics, and the Development of Intelligent Structures. The company provides design and manufacturing technology solutions for the automotive, aeronautics, infrastructure, and other industrial sectors. It operates in the Aerospace & Defense, Infrastructure, and Intelligent Robots segments. The majority of the company's revenues are derived from the Intelligent Robots segment that caters to the automotive sector, specifically, in assembly, test, and test lines.

Valuation ^Qas of 8 Apr 2025

At face value, Airtificial Intelligence Structures SA looks inexpensive, following a substantial price decline over the past year. To account for the risk of a possible value trap, we have capped its rating at 3 stars. The stock currently trades at a 29% discount to our quantitative fair value estimate of 0.16 EUR per share; however, caution is warranted due to this estimate's high uncertainty rating.

The firm's valuation metrics bolster our estimated fair value. A company's valuation metrics provide insights into the market's expectations for its future growth and profitability. Reflecting the firm's valuation is its enterprise value to revenue ratio of 1.4, which falls in the bottom 40% compared with global peers. The prevailing enterprise value/sales ratio is low relative to the long-term earnings power of the business. We believe this is a sign that shares could be undervalued.

The firm's favorable dividend structure is an additional encouraging factor. While they may not provide a stable form of cash flow, low dividend payments can suggest reinvestment opportunities. The firm's dividend payout ratio of 0%, for example, sits in the bottom 20% globally. This company's relatively low dividend payout ratio may put off some investors but can also signal that the company has plenty of reinvestment opportunities for its earnings. This characteristic further promotes our favorable price/fair value ratio.


Economic Moat ^Qas of 8 Apr 2025

Quantitative Equity Report Overview

The quantitative report on equities consists of data, statistics and quantitative equity ratings on equity securities. Morningstar, Inc.'s quantitative equity ratings are forward looking and are generated by a statistical model that is based on Morningstar Inc.'s analyst-driven equity ratings and quantitative statistics. Given the nature of the quantitative report and the quantitative ratings, there is no one analyst in which a given report is attributed to; however, Jeffrey Ptak, Chief Ratings Officer for Morningstar Research Services LLC is responsible for overseeing the methodology that supports the quantitative equity ratings used in this report. As an employee of Morningstar Research Services' Code of Ethics and the Morningstar, Inc. Code of Ethics and Personal Securities trading Policy in carrying out his responsibilities.

Quantitative Equity Ratings

Morningstar's quantitative equity ratings consist of: (i) Quantitative Fair Value Estimate, (ii) Quantitative Star Rating, (iii) Quantitative Uncertainty, (iv) Quantitative Economic Moat, and (v) Quantitative Financial Health (collectively the "Quantitative Ratings).

The Quantitative Ratings are calculated daily and derived from the analystdriven ratings of a company's peers as determined by statistical algorithms. Morningstar, Inc. ("Morningstar", "we", "our") calculates Quantitative Ratings for companies whether or not it already provides analyst ratings and qualitative coverage. In some cases, the Quantitative Ratings may differ from the analyst ratings because a company's analyst-driven ratings can significantly differ from other companies in its peer group.

i. **Quantitative Fair Value Estimate:** Intended to represent Morningstar's estimate of the per share dollar amount that a company's equity is worth today. Morningstar calculates the Quantitative Fair Value Estimate using a statistical model derived from the Fair Value Estimate Morningstar's equity analysts assign to companies. ii. **Quantitative Economic Moat:** Intended to describe the strength of a firm's competitive position. It is calculated using an algorithm designed to predict the Economic Moat rating a Morningstar analyst would assign to the stock. The rating is expressed as Narrow, Wide, or None.

Narrow – assigned when the probability of a stock receiving a "Wide Moat" rating by an analyst is greater than 70% but less than 99%.

Wide – assigned when the probability of a stock receiving a "Wide Moat" rating by an analyst is greater than 99%.

None – assigned when the probability of an analyst receiving a "Wide Moat" rating by an analyst is less than 70%.

iii. **Quantitative Star Rating:** Intended to be the summary rating based on the combination of our Quantitative Fair Value Estimate, current market price, Quantitative Uncertainty Rating, and momentum. The rating is expressed as One-Star, Two-Star, Three-Star, Four-Star, and Five-Star.

Under Review – Morningstar will assign a rating of "Under Review" in three scenarios: when there is occurrence of a corporate event, when the closing price is unavailable for at least 7 days, or when the quantitative Fair Value to Price Ratio does not fall into the expected range of 0.25-4.

 $Not\ Rated$ – Morningstar will assign a rating of 'Not Rated' when closing price data is unavailable for at least 30 days.

Momentum Flag – After the initial calculation for the star rating, there is a final filtering step based on the momentum of the company. We rank the companies based on their 12-1 month momentum, then restrict those below the 30th percentile to a maximum of 3 stars.

iv. **Quantitative Uncertainty:** Intended to represent Morningstar's level of uncertainty about the accuracy of the Quantitative Fair Value Estimate. Generally, the lower the Quantitative Uncertainty, the narrower the potential range of outcomes for that particular company. The rating is expressed as Low, Medium, High, Very High, and Extreme.

Low – the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 10% Medium – the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 15% but greater than 10%

High-the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 35% but greater than 15%

 $Very\ High\ -$ the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 80% but greater than 35%

 $\ensuremath{\textit{Extreme}}$ — the interquartile range for possible fair values is greater than 80%

v. **Quantitative Financial Health:** Intended to reflect the probability that a firm will face financial distress in the near future. The calculation uses a predictive model designed to anticipate when a company may default on its financial obligations. The rating is expressed as Weak, Moderate, and Strong.

Weak – assigned when Quantitative Financial Health < 0.2

Strong – assigned when Quantitative Financial Health > 0.7

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Fairly Valued – Last Price is in line with Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

Overvalued – Last Price is above Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

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The ESG Risk Rating Assessment is a visual representation of Sustainalytics ESG Risk Categories on a 1 to 5 scale.
