



#### **Business Description**

Pharma Mar ŚA is engaged in the research, development, production, and commercialization of bioactive principles of marine origin for application in oncology. It also produces and market insecticides and air fresheners for household use, household products, wood treatment and decoration products, paints, and similar products. Its operating business segments are Oncology, Diagnostics, Consumer chemicals, and RNAi. The company obtains its revenues from two main areas: biopharmaceuticals and consumer chemicals, but the biopharmaceuticals is the main line of business.

### Valuation <sup>Q</sup>as of 7 May 2024

Morningstar maintains a 3-star quantitative star rating for Pharma Mar, derived from the firm's valuation and uncertainty scores.

The company's shares last closed at 31.60, below our quantitative fair value estimate of 38.53. These shares have traded between a 47.54% and 9.38% discount to their fair value estimate over the past year. In Morningstar's equity coverage universe for this methodology, the company's valuation rating lands at the 61st percentile; in the healthcare sector, the firm's score lies at the 73rd percentile (meaning the shares are more undervalued than 73% of stocks in the sector).

Furthermore, Pharma Mar maintains a quantitative valuation uncertainty rating of High.

The company has held this star rating over the past year. The uncertainty rating for Pharma Mar has remained High since the previous rating of Very High, which was last assigned on 05/03/2024.

The key factors behind these ratings are the company's earnings yield and drawdown. The earnings yield is 0.36%, and its maximum trailing 12-month maximum drawdown is 57.59%. The earnings yield falls at the 63rd percentile in the healthcare sector

while the drawdown is at the 45th percentile. Over the past year, the company's earnings yield has been between 0.20% and 5.38%; its drawdown has ranged between 24.19% and 57.59%.

## Economic Moat <sup>Q</sup>as of 7 May 2024

Quantitatively, we do not believe Pharma Mar has an economic moat. Its moat score of 0.47 corresponds to the 50th percentile in the healthcare sector. Furthermore, this rating last differed from its previous rating of Narrow on 09/27/2023, when the company's moat score fell from its maximum of 0.76 (score of 1 indicates greatest economic moat). The company also maintains a quantitative financial health rating of Strong. Its score sits at the 90th percentile overall and the 95th percentile in the sector

Examining the company's financials and market statistics, we find these ratings are principally driven by its book value yield and enterprise value-to-market value ratio. The book value yield is 34.83%, sitting at the 51st percentile in the healthcare sector. The company's enterprise value-to-market value ratio is 0.78, corresponding to the 18th percentile in the equity coverage universe and the 24th percentile in the sector.

### Fundamentals as of 7 May 2024


The earnings per share for Pharma Mar is 0.11. The company earns a return on invested capital of 0.82%, falling at the 58th percentile in the health-care sector. The firm maintains a dividend yield of 2.14%. We calculate the above figures over a trailing 12-month period.

Examining valuation further, we find Pharma Mar holds a price-to-earnings ratio of 280, a figure greater than 95% of its sector peers.

# **Quantitative Equity Report Overview**

The quantitative report on equities consists of data, statistics and quantitative equity ratings on equity securities. Morningstar, Inc.'s quantitative equity ratings are forward looking and are generated by a statistical model that is based on Morningstar Inc.'s analyst-driven equity ratings and quantitative statistics. Given the nature of the quantitative report and the quantitative ratings, there is no one analyst in which a given report is attributed to; however, Mr. Lee Davidson, Head of Quantitative Research for Morningstar, Inc., is responsible for overseeing the methodology that supports the quantitative equity ratings used in this report. As an employee of Morningstar, Inc., Mr. Davidson is guided by Morningstar, Inc.'s Code of Ethics and Personal Securities Trading Policy in carrying out his responsibilities.

## **Quantitative Equity Ratings**

Morningstar's quantitative equity ratings consist of: (i) Quantitative Fair Value Estimate, (ii) Quantitative Star Rating, (iii) Quantitative Uncertainty, (iv) Quantitative Economic Moat, and (v) Quantitative Financial Health (collectively the "Quantitative Ratings).

The Quantitative Ratings are calculated daily and derived from the analyst-driven ratings of a company's peers as determined by statistical algorithms. Morningstar, Inc. ("Morningstar", "we", "our") calculates Quantitative Ratings for companies whether or not it already provides analyst ratings and qualitative coverage. In some cases, the Quantitative Ratings may differ from the analyst ratings because a company's analyst-driven ratings can significantly differ from other companies in its peer group.

- i. Quantitative Fair Value Estimate: Intended to represent Morningstar's estimate of the per share dollar amount that a company's equity is worth today. Morningstar calculates the Quantitative Fair Value Estimate using a statistical model derived from the Fair Value Estimate Morningstar's equity analysts assign to companies. Please go to http://global.morningstar.com/equitydisclosures for information about Fair Value Estimate Morningstar's equity analysts assign to companies.
- ii. **Quantitative Economic Moat:** Intended to describe the strength of a firm's competitive position. It is calculated using an algorithm designed to predict the Economic Moat rating a Morningstar analyst would assign to the stock. The rating is expressed as Narrow, Wide, or None.

**Narrow** – assigned when the probability of a stock receiving a "Wide Moat" rating by an analyst is greater than 70% but less than 99%.

**Wide** — assigned when the probability of a stock receiving a "Wide Moat" rating by an analyst is greater than 99%.

**None** – assigned when the probability of an analyst receiving a "Wide Moat" rating by an analyst is less than 70%.

- iii. **Quantitative Star Rating:** Intended to be the summary rating based on the combination of our Quantitative Fair Value Estimate, current market price, Quantitative Uncertainty Rating, and momentum. The rating is expressed as One-Star, Two-Star, Three-Star, Four-Star, and Five-Star.

After the initial calculation for the star rating, there is a final filtering step based on the momentum of the company. We rank the companies based on their 12-1 month momentum, then restrict those below the 30th percentile to a maximum of 3 stars

iv. **Quantitative Uncertainty:** Intended to represent Morningstar's level of uncertainty about the accuracy of the Quantitative Fair Value Estimate. Generally, the lower the Quantitative Uncertainty, the narrower the potential range of outcomes for that particular company. The rating is expressed as Low, Medium, High, Very High, and Extreme.

Low – the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 10%
Medium – the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 15%
but greater than 10%

**High** – the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 35% but greater than 15%

**Very High** – the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 80% but greater than 35%

v. Quantitative Financial Health: Intended to reflect the probability that a firm will face financial distress in the near future. The calculation uses a predictive model designed to anticipate when a company may default on its financial obligations. The rating is expressed as Weak, Moderate, and Strong.

Weak — assigned when Quantitative Financial Health < 0.2

Moderate — assigned when Quantitative Financial Health is between 0.2

and 0.7

Strong – assigned when Quantitative Financial Health > 0.7

### Other Definitions

- i. Last Close Price of the stock as of the close of the market of the last trading day before date of the report.
- Quantitative Valuation— Using the below terms, intended to denote the relationship between the security's Last Price and Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate for that security.

**Undervalued – Last Price** is below Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

**Farily Valued – Last Price** is in line with Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

**Farily Valued – Last Price** is in line with Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

Overvalued – Last Price is above Morningstar's quantitative fair value

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Sustainalytics analyzes over 1,300 data points to assess a company's exposure to and management of ESG risks. In other words, ESG Risk Ratings measures a company's unmanaged ESG Risks represented as a quantitative score. Unmanaged Risk is measured on an open-ended scale starting at zero (no risk) with lower scores representing less unmanaged risk and, for 95% of cases, the unmanaged ESG Risk score is below 50.

Based on their quantitative scores, companies are grouped into one of five Risk Categories (negligible, low, medium, high, severe). These risk categories are absolute, meaning that a 'high risk' assessment reflects a comparable degree



of unmanaged ESG risk across all subindustries covered.

The ESG Risk Rating Assessment is a visual representation of Sustainalytics ESG Risk Categories on a 1 to 5 scale.
